Duolingo Owl Pencil Holder

Ages: 5-12

Materials

 Clay, Basic hand-building tools (rolling pin, cutting tool, scoring tool, slip, modeling tools) water, Glaze, Kiln, Pencil and paper (for initial design)

Art Techniques

- Pinch Pot (for main body)
- Sculpting (for eyes, beak, wings, feathers)
- Scoring and Slipping (for attachment)
- Shaping (for owl form)
- Finishing

Art Principles/ Elements

- Form (cylindrical pot, owl features)
- Function (holding pencils)
- Proportion (of features to body)
- Balance (stability of pot)
- Design (character representation)

Instructions

- 1. On paper, design your Duolingo owl pencil holder, sketching a cylindrical pot shape with an owl's face, wings, and spiky top.
- 2. Take a ball of clay and gently push your thumb into the center, then pinch outwards with your thumb and fingers to create a tall, cylindrical pot shape with even walls.
- 3. Roll out small pieces of clay and sculpt two large eyes, a small triangular beak, and two wing shapes for the owl.
- 4. Score and slip all the sculpted owl features onto the outside of your pinch pot, blending the joins smoothly, and pinch the top rim to create "feathers" or spikes.
- 5. Refine all details, smooth any rough areas, and allow your finished Duolingo owl pencil holder to dry completely.
- 6. Glaze to your liking and fire when completely dry!
