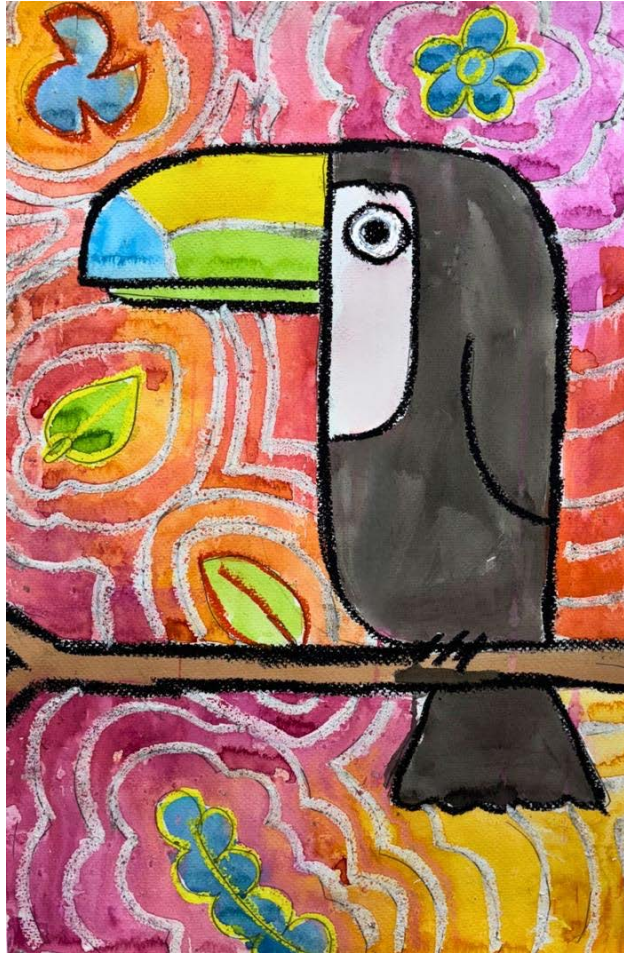


Teach art principles & feel free to adapt this to you — creativity is encouraged for both teachers & students.



**Toucan with Wax Resist**

**Ages:** 5-7

**Materials:**

- Watercolor paper, watercolor, oil pastels, Pencil, Paper towel, water bucket, paintbrushes

**Art Techniques**

- Line Drawing
- Crayon Resist
- Flat Coloring
- Pattern making
- Contrast

**Art Principles/ Elements**

- Emphasis
- Color
- Line
- Pattern
- Contrast

**Instructions**

1. Use your pencil to draw a large toucan sitting on a branch, filling most of your paper, and then sketch in large, swirling floral or abstract shapes for the background.
2. Use a white oil pastel to trace over all your pencil lines patterns in the background, making them bold, and draw any additional patterns within the background shapes to create texture. Use a black oil pastel to outline of the toucan and the brown branch.
3. Paint the entire background with various bright watercolor paints, allowing the colors to blend and letting the oil pastel lines resist the paint, making them stand out.
4. Paint the branch brown.
5. Once the background is dry, paint the toucan's body black, its eye white with a black pupil, and its large beak with yellow, green, and blue.
