Zentangle Giraffe

Ages: 8-Adult

Materials

Thick paper, watercolor, Pencil, Paper towel, water bucket, permanent marker, paintbrushes

Art Techniques

- Line Drawing
- Watercolor Wet-on-Wet
- Blending Colors
- Zentangle-inspired patterns
- Contrast

Art Principles/ Elements

- Emphasis
- Color
- Line
- Pattern
- Contrast

Instructions

- 1. Use your pencil to lightly draw a large giraffe head and neck on your watercolor paper, filling most of the space.
- 2. Wet the entire background area around the giraffe drawing with a clean, wet paintbrush, then drop in pink, purple, and blue watercolors, allowing them to spread and blend freely using the wet-on-wet technique.
- 3. Once the watercolor background is completely dry, use a fine-tip black permanent marker to carefully outline the giraffe shape.
- 4. Inside the giraffe's outline, draw many different small patterns and designs, like dots, swirls, lines, and zigzags, filling its entire body with intricate details.
- 5. Add final small details to the giraffe's face like its eyes, and darken some of the patterns to create more contrast and depth within the drawing.
