

Impressionist Owl

Ages: 5-12

Materials

Canvas, acrylics, paintbrushes, white chalk pastel, paper towel

Art Techniques

- Animal Portraiture
- Impressionism
- Mark Making (flat brush vs. round brush)
- Splatter Painting

Art Principles

- Focal Point
- Symmetry
- Light and Shadow
- Texture

Instructions

- 1. Paint the entire canvas with light color, painting with loose strokes in different directions. Dry canvas.
- 2. Sketch owl using white chalk pastel, wiping away any mistakes using a damp paper towel.
- 3. Paint an underpainting for the owl using a neutral, dull brown color. The reason you want it to be slightly dull is so that the bright colors will show up on top.
- 4. Use small, round brush to make vines on sides of owl. Add leaves of muted colors along vines.
- 5. Paint the facial features—eyes and beak
- 6. Use a round brush for the face feathers. Add different colors and values on top of the underpainting to create texture. Paint outward in a radial direction.
- 7. Use a flat brush for the body feathers and paint them vertically. Allow the underpainting to show through at times.
- 8. Add shadows in the ears and under the plumicorns.
- 9. Bring out highlights, including white feathers and highlights in the eyes.
- 10. Add splatter paint on top of canvas.
